28	for Psychoanalytic Studies, Owner, Barry Ross, CEO (Respondent). On or about March 23,

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1	2012, Barry Ross certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers,				
2	and representations in the application. The Bureau denied the application on June 5, 2015.				
3	JURISDICTION				
4	3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of				
5	Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the				
6	authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code unless				
7	otherwise indicated.

This may include contacting an institution to which you may seek to transfer after attending (name of institution) to determine if your (credits or degree, diploma, or certificate) will transfer."

17	Respondent's response to the deficiency letter.
18	24. On February 23, 2015, the Bureau sent Respondent a third letter advising that the
19	Bureau could not grant Respondent a renewal of approval to operate because of deficiencies in
20	the application, including deficiencies pertaining to the institution's organization and
21	management, enrollment agreement, the instruction and degrees offered, the description of the
22	educational programs, school catalog, financial statements and resources, faculty, and graduation
23	or completion document. On March 27, 2015, the Bureau received Respondent's response to the
24	deficiency letter.
25	25. On June 5, 2015, the Bureau denied Respondent's Application for Renewal of
26	Approval to Operate a Non-Accredited Institution and sent Respondent a "Notice of Denial."
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FACTS

6	27. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891,

8	does not contain the period covered by the enrollment agreement.

27	and (z), each quarter unit requires 10 hours of instruction and each semester unit requires 15
28	hours of instruction.

1 (Failure to Demonstrate Continued Capacity to Satisfy Minimum Operating Standards 2 - Financial Resources and Statements) 3 Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891, 29. 4 subdivision (b), section 94885, and title 5, CCR, section 71745, in that Respondent failed to 5 provide a current, reviewed financial statement conducted and prepared in accordance with the 6 generally accepted accounting principles showing the ratio of current assets to current liabilities 7 of 1.25 to 1.00. "Current" with respect to financial statements is defined in title 5, CCR, section 8 74115, subdivision (d). Respondent submitted financial statements completed on October 8, 2014 9 for the year ending June 30, 2014 and received by the Bureau on March 27, 2015. The financial 10 statements failed to also include no less than five months of the current fiscal year. The 11 submitted financial statements do not clearly state values for current assets and liabilities. 12 FIFTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION 13 (Failure to Demonstrate Continued Capacity to Satisfy Minimum Operating Standards 14 - Catalog) 15 30. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891, 16 subdivision (b), and section 94909 in that that the school catalog contained the following 17 deficiencies: 18 The catalog does not contain the required heading related to the "Notice of a. 19 Transferability of Credits" as required by Code section 94909(a)(15). 20The catalog does not contain the schedule of total charges for the Doctor of b. 21 Philosophy in Psychoanalysis program as required by Code section 94909(a)(9). 22 The catalog contains incorrect descriptions of the student's rights and responsibilities c. 23 with respect to the Student Tuition Recovery Fund ("STRF"), in violation of title 5, CCR, 24 94909(a)(14), as follows: 25 i. The catalog states students have up to 60 days following school closure to file their 26 STRF claim. Pursuant to title 5, CCR, Section 76200(b), students have up to two years to file 27 their STRF claim if they were notified, or up to four years following school closure. 28 14

ii. The catalog states the STRF assessment fee is 50 cents per \$1,000 of tuition,however the current fee is zero per \$1,000 of tuition.

d. The catalog does not contain the institution's policies and practices, including required disclosures regarding any form of financial aid, in violation of title 5, CCR, section 71810(b)(6).

SIXTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Demonstrate Continued Capacity to Satisfy Minimum Operating Standards - School Performance Fact Sheets and Annual Report)

31. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891,
subdivision (b), and section 94934, subdivision (a) and title 5, CCR, Section 74112, subdivisions
(c) and (d) in that the institution's website failed to provide correct School Performance Fact
Sheet ("SPFS") and annual report information as follows:

a. The reporting of "Students Available for Graduation" on both the 2013 SPFS and
annual report failed to comply with title 5, CCR, Section 74112, subdivisions (c) and (d), because
Respondent did not report the same number of "Number of Students Who Began Program" and
"Students Available for Graduation." "Students Available for Graduation" is defined as "the
number of students who began the program minus the number of "Students Unavailable for
Graduation." Students are "unavailable for graduation" if they have died, been incarcerated, or
called to active military duty.

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b. Respondent failed to provide SPFS data for the branch campus.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a
decision:

Denying the application of Newport Psychoanalytic Institute, Newport Center for
 Psychoanalytic Studies, Owner, Barry Ross, CEO, for a Renewal of Approval to Operate and
 Offer Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions; and,

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
