### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

If you cancel or withdraw your enrollment and request a refund, please do so in writing on the form provided by Rosemead College (RC). Deliver your notice to RC at the address of the location in which you intended to enroll (Rosemead campus or Torrance campus), as shown on page 1 of this agreement. The notice should be addressed to the school director.
