

STIPULATED DENIAL OF

18 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
19 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

20 PARTIES

21 1. Joanne Wenzel, the former Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education
22 ("Bureau"), brought this action solely in her official capacity and was represented in this matter
23 by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Carter Ott, Deputy Attorney
24 General. Complainant Leeza Rifredi ("Complainant") is the current Deputy Chief of the Bureau,
25 and is prosecuting this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by
26 Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Carter Ott, Deputy Attorney
27 General.

1 13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
2 copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, including PDF and facsimile
3 signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

4 14. This Stipulated Denial of Application for Approval to Operate and Order is intended
5 by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive
6 embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements,
7 understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This stipulation
8 and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by
9 a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

10 15. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
11 the Director may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following
12 Order:

13 ORDER

14 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent Coding House Institute's Application for
15 Approval to Operate an Institution Non-Accredited is denied.

16 1. This stipulation constitutes a record of denial, and shall become part of Respondent's
17 application history with the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education.

18 2. Acceptance of this stipulation does not prohibit the Bureau from initiating or
19 prosecuting any other matter related to Respondent's violation of California Education Code
20 sections 94886 and 94927.5.

21 3. Respondent shall comply with the California Private Postsecondary Education Act of
22 2009 (Education Code section 94800 *et seq.*), including, but not limited to, Education Code
23 sections 94886 and 94927.5.

24 4. The Bureau reserves the right to take action against Respondent for any failure to
25 abide by the terms of this stipulation.

26 ACCEPTANCE

27 I have carefully read the Stipulated Denial of Application for Approval to Operate and
28 Order. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Application. I enter into this

1 Stipulated Denial of Application for Approval to Operate and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and
2 intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Director of the Department
3 of Consumer Affairs.

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
