FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(Failure to Provide Compliant Organizational Chart)

27. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, sections 71140, subdivision (c), and 71730, subdivision (a), because Respondents' institution has neither a Chief Academic Officer nor a Chief Operational Officer, as required by these regulations. Moreover, Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, sections 71140, subdivision (a), and 71730, subdivisions (a), (b), and (f) in that the organizational chart lists only two employees, both of whom are owners. Three positions are vacant: Administrative Assistant, LMS Administrator, and Bookkeeper. Only one individual is identified as a faculty member. Respondents do not have the administrative personnel to ensure the achievement of the institution's mission and objectives and the operation of the educational programs.

## SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(Failure to Provide Compliant Exemplars of Student Agreements)

28. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, section 71800 in that the Enrollment Agreement fails to include a Program Start Date and Scheduled Completion Date.

#### THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL

# (Insufficient Description of Instruction and Degrees Offered)

29. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, sections 71210, subdivision (c)(2), and 71770, subdivision (a)(1), in that Respondents failed to provide a sufficiently detailed description of the instruction and degrees offered. The application response to Section 13, question 1, states that an "ability to benefit" test is not applicable. But the catalog refers to the Accuplacer ATB Certification Test as the ATB test used by Respondents. Thus the admissions procedures in the catalog are inconsistent with the response provided in the application for renewal.

# **FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL**

# (Lack of Required Description of Educational Program)

30. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, sections 71710, subdivisions (c)(2), and (e), and 71715, subdivision (b), in that Respondents only provided course

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards—Distance Learning)

31. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, section 71715, subdivisions (d)(2) and (4), in that Respondents have not provided a syllabi, in a distance education modality, that meets regulatory requirements. Respondents have not been approved to offer programs via distance education. There is not a preadmission assessment to assess a student to determine if he/she has the skills and competencies to succeed in a distance education environment. Likewise, the syllabi do not indicate how a faculty member will provide for meaningful interaction and does not include clear standards for satisfactory academic progress.

#### **SIXTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL**

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards—Faculty)

32. Respondents' application is subject to denial under CCR, title 5, sections 71715, subdivision (d)(6), and 71720, subdivision (b), in that Respondents have not provided sufficient documentation that it has contracted with duly qualified faculty members to deliver instruction and ensure that students will meet the educational objectives of the program. The Bureau requested that Respondents provide the curriculum vitae of all faculty members, teaching contracts (between Respondents and the faculty members), and any licenses, certifications, or credentials to assist the Bureau in determining if the faculty are duly qualified. Respondents failed to provide this information, and instead provide a link routed to Skillsoft's website with faculty information.

#### **SEVENTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL**

### (Lack of Required Content in School Catalog)

33. Respondents' application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94909, subdivision (a)(7), in that the catalog does not contain information regarding the faculty and their qualifications.

#### **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- Denying the application of Rashad M. Said and Joanne Westerberg for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions for Advanced Vocational Institute, a non-accredited institution; and,
  - 2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
