5	CEC § 94913 (a)(5)	Violation Description: The institution failed to post on its website, a link to the institution's most recent annual report submitted to the Bureau. According to Bureau

6	CEC § 94897 (I)	Violation Description: On the institution's Accreditation and Approval's webpage (https://www.aimc.edu/accreditation-and-approvals/#disclosures), the institution states it is approved to operate by the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, however the institution failed to define the term approved to operate.
		Correction: The institution shall update the statement on its website, where the institution identifies it is approved to operate by the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education to state, "BPPE APPROVED - Approval to Operate means compliance with state standards as set forth in the California Private Postsecondary Education Act of 2009".
7	5 CCR § 71760	<b>Violation Description:</b> The institution failed to provide self-monitoring procedures used by the institution to assure that it is maintained and operated in compliance with the Act and this Division.
		<b>Correction:</b> The institution shall provide a copy of its self-monitoring procedures used by the institution to assure that it is maintained and operated in compliance with the Act and this Division, pursuant to 5 CCR § 71760.

Pursuant to 5 CCR section 75010(d), the Institution may do either of the following:

- (1) Within 30 days from the date of the inspection, sign and return the notice to comply, declaring under penalty of perjury that the violation was corrected and describing how compliance was achieved; or
- (2) Within 30 days from the date of the inspection, file with the Bureau a written notice of disagreement, specifying the minor violations described in the notice to comply with which the person approved to operate the institution disagrees, and appealing it by requesting an informal office conference. If a written notice of disagreement is not timely filed with the Bureau, the right to appeal is deemed to have been waived.

## Pursuant to CEC section 94935(h), failure to comply with the notice to comply will result in the Bureau taking appropriate administrative enforcement action.

The Notice to Comply was given to the Institution's owner, person in control, chief academic officer, chief executive officer, chief operating officer, institution director, or any person delegated by any of the aforementioned persons to facilitate the inspection or accept such notice as set forth below.
