| | 5. Section 94817 states: | | |
| | "'Approval to operate' or 'approval' means the authorization pursuant to this chapter to | | |
| | offer to the public and to provide postsecondary educational programs, as well as the written | | |
| | document issued to an institution signifying its approval to operate." | | |
| | 6. Section 94817.5 states: | | |
| | "Approved to operate' or 'approved' means that an institution has received authorization | | |
| | pursuant to this chapter to offer to the public and to provide postsecondary educational | | |

| | 7. Section 94885 states, in part: | | |
| | "(a)The bureau shall adopt by regulation minimum operating standards for an institution | | |

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"(9) The institution is maintained and operated in compliance with this chapter and all other applicable ordinances and laws.

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8. Section 94886 states:

"Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter."

9. Section 94887 states:

"An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards."

10. Section 94891 states, in part:

- "(a) The bureau shall adopt by regulation the process and procedures whereby an institution may obtain a renewal of an approval to operate.
- "(b) To be granted a renewal of an approval to operate, the institution shall demonstrate its continued capacity to meet the minimum operating standards.
- "(c)(1) An institution that is denied renewal of an approval to operate may file an appeal in accordance with the procedures established by the bureau pursuant to Section 94888.
- "(2) An institution that has filed an appeal of a denial of a renewal application may continue to operate during the appeal process, but must disclose in a written statement, approved by the bureau, to all current and prospective students, that the institution's application for renewal of approval to operate was denied by the bureau because the bureau determined the application did not satisfy the requirements to operate in California, that the institution is appealing the bureau's decision, and that the loss of the appeal may result in the institution's closure.

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"(kk) An incomplete application filed under this section will render the institution ineligible for renewal.

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- 13. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115 states, in part:
- "(a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.
- "(b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance sheet, an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:
- "(1) Audited and reviewed financial statements shall be conducted and prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants by an independent certified public accountant who is not an employee, officer, or corporate director or member of the governing board of the institution.

. . .

"(d) "Current" with respect to financial statements means completed no sooner than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no less than the most recent complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that current fiscal year."

PART I – FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

14. Among other things, renewal applications must include a current financial statement reviewed in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (also known as GAAP). Rather than offering financial statements, Respondent submitted his Renewal Application to the Bureau, on or about March 8, 2022, with a balance sheet and statement of cash flow for the year ending on December 31, 2021. Following review and analysis of the Renewal Application, the Bureau informed Respondent in a letter dated April 19, 2022 that his balance sheet and cash flow statement were insufficient and directed him to submit compliant financial statements.

- 15. On or about July 19, 2022, Respondent submitted to the Bureau a reviewed financial statement for the year ending on December 31, 2021. This financial statement was not prepared in accordance with GAAP. In response, on or about July 21, 2022, the Bureau sent Respondent a letter detailing deficiencies in his Renewal Application, including that Respondent's financial statements were not compliant with applicable regulations.
- 16. On or about November 3, 2022, Respondent submitted to the Bureau further documents and information to resolve deficiencies in his Renewal Application. Again, Respondent failed to offer compliant financial statements. Instead, with this November 3, 2022 submission, Respondent offered the Bureau a copy of the same deficient financial statement he submitted to the Bureau on or about July 19, 2022.
- 17. On or about May 13, 2024, the Bureau sent Respondent another letter detailing deficiencies in his Renewal Application, including a request that Respondent provide compliant financial statements. Again, Respondent failed to offer compliant financial statements. Instead, on or about June 12, 2024, Respondent submitted to the Bureau another copy of the same deficient financial statement he submitted to the Bureau on or about July 19, 2022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Financial Statements Reviewed According to GAAP)

18. Respondent's Renewal Application is subject to denial based on his failure to provide compliant financial statements. (Educ. Code § 94885, subds. (a)(6) and (a)(9), and California Code of Regulations, title 5, §§ 71475, subds. (b), (e), and (k)(k) and 74115, subds. (a) and (b)(1).) In particular, the financial statements Respondent submitted were not reviewed in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, as required by California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115, subdivision (b)(1). The circumstances are set forth in paragraphs 14 through 17, above.

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SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

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(Current Financial Statements)

Respondent's Renewal Application is subject to denial based on his failure to provide current financial statements. (Educ. Code § 94885, subds. (a)(6) and (a)(9), and Cal. Code Regs., title 5, §§ 71475, subds. (b), (e), (w)(2), and (k)(k) and 74115, subds. (a) and (d)). In particular, as described in paragraphs 14 through 17, above, Respondent failed to submit financial statements that are current, as required by California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71475, subdivision (e) and in accordance with the definition in California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115, subdivision (d). California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71475, subdivision (e) requires, in part, that the financial statements submitted with a renewal application be "current." California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115, subdivision (d) defines "current" "with respect to financial statements" as completed no sooner than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no less than the most recent complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that current fiscal year. The financial statements Respondent submitted, for the year ending December 31, 2021, are not current because they do not cover the most recent complete fiscal year nor five months of the current fiscal year. /// /// /// /// /// /// /// /// ///

Denying the Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate an Institution Non-5 Accredited submitted for Vista IT Training, owned by Brian Yung; and 6 2.
