- **Cancellation after the Start of Class:** If an applicant cancels after class begins, but before the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later, a full refund of all monies paid will be made to the applicant.

If any books and supplies were distributed to the student prior to cancellation, the student is responsible for the charges associated with those distributions. The student has the option to return any unused books and supplies within 30 days following the date of cancellation. The student will receive full credit to their account if returned in new condition.

NHI will refund 100% of any monies paid, less any charges for books and supplies retained by the student within 45 days of cancellation.

If the student has received federal financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund moneys not paid from student financial aid program funds.
