Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Each student has the right to cancel/voluntarily terminate the program and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. If a student wishes to cancel/terminate the enrollment agreement or withdraw from the institution, the student must notify PMCI. Notice may be hand delivered or mailed. Last Acceptable Date of Withdrawal for Full Refund: (7 Days after enrollment or first class session – whichever is later) _____

If the student withdraws from a course after instruction has started, the student may receive a pro-rated refund for instruction paid for but not received. *Refund calculations will be based on the day a withdrawal letter or notice is received. NOTE: A student is charged for an entire week not by the day. An instructional week is approximately \$450. If books are purchased for a student and they cancel after books are ordered for them, they will be charged a handling/return fee of \$100 to ship and return unused books.*

No refunds will be given if the student has attended more than 75% of the course and the student concerned will still be liable for any tuition due. Also, if the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of money not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
