You may cancel this agreement and receive a refund through the 1st day of attendance or 7 days after enrollment, whichever is later, by providing a written notice to. Vajra Matusow, Director, Diamond Light School of Massage and Healing Arts.

REFUND INFORMATION

The student has a right to a full refund of all charges less the amount of \$100.00 for the registration fee if he/she cancel this agreement prior to or through the 1st day of attendance or 7 days after enrollment, whichever is later. In addition, the student may withdraw from a course after instruction has started and receive a pro rata refund for the unused portion of tuition and other refundable charges if the student has completed 60% or less of the instruction. For example, if the student completes only 30 hours of a 100 hour course, and paid \$1,000.00 for tuition, the student would receive a refund of \$700.00. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
