Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, who employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination the six month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduates or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student may cancel the enrollment agreement for school, without any penalty or obligations by the seventh business day after the first class session as described in the *Notice of Cancellation* form. Any notification of withdrawal must be made in writing by the 7th business day after the first class session. The effective date for the cancellation will be the last date of attendance.

CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY*

After the end of the cancellation period, refunds will be awarded according to the schedule below:

- A student who withdraws from the GSE prior to the end of the seventh business day following the first class session is eligible to receive a full refund of tuition and fees.
- Any student who officially withdraws from the GSE prior to the end of the fourth week of classes is eligible to receive 75% of tuition and fees.
- Any student who officially withdraws from the GSE prior to the end of the sixth week of classes is eligible to receive 50% of tuition and fees.
- Any student who officially withdraws from the GSE prior to the end of the eighth week of classes is eligible to receive 25% of tuition and fees.
- Any student withdrawing from the GSE after the beginning of the ninth week of the term will receive no reduction of his/her semester charges.
- Failure to attend class does not constitute official course drop/withdrawal.

If a student has received federal financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
