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Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable education program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.



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- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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STUDENTS RIGHT TO CANCEL

The registration fee of \$75.00 is non-refundable.

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

The registration fee is refundable.

The student must notify the school in writing (e-mail is accepted) that he/she is canceling. A withdrawal may be effectuated in writing or by the student's actions. A withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. Hence, an absence with no communication to the school may be taken as a withdrawal. It is our policy to confirm your intentions by e-mail or telephone, but if you do not respond within a week after our attempt to confirm with you, we will interpret the lack of communication to be a withdrawal.

A refund will be given for any charges paid up to and including the first class session, or after the seventh day of enrollment, whichever is later. If the student cancels after the first class session and/or after the 7th day after enrollment (whichever is later), a prorated calculation of the registration fee will be made of the refund based on number of days in class divided by total number of days in the course (22).

Example 1: Student pays \$1,000 at the date of enrollment and sends us a cancellation notification the first day of class. The student will receive a \$1,000 refund. If the student pays \$1000 at any point prior to class and enrolls the first day of class and cancels on the first day of class, they receive a refund of \$1000. The registration fee is refunded in all circumstances. If a STRF fee is collected, it is non-refundable.

Example 2: Student pays \$1000 at the date of enrollment (January 2) and paid no other moneys to date. Class starts January 6. The student sends us a cancellation notice on January 15. It is past 7 days from enrollment. The class cost is \$4,650 including registration fee. The student has been in class 7 days. Saturdays and Sundays are not included in the calculation. $7/22 \times \$3,695$ (tuition including registration fee) - \$75 (non-refundable registration fee) + \$125 (books and supplies not returned in pristine condition) (if book and supplies are returned in pristine

condition there will be no charge) = \$1427.05 - the prorated portion of the class that would be charged to the student, so no refund would be paid, and the student would owe us \$1,427.05 –



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\$1,000 – \$75 or \$352.05. The registration fee is non-refundable in all circumstances. If a STRF fee is collected, it is not refundable

Any student has the right to cancel or withdraw from this course at any time, but if the student has received financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. Program funds include WIA funds. The institution shall pay or credit refunds within 45 days of a student's cancellation or withdrawal
