The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of all institutional charges paid, less the non-refundable fee through attendance at the first session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

The student has the right to withdraw at any time from the course of instruction after the cancellation period and receive a pro-rata refund for the unused portion of the tuition and other refundable charges if student reaches 60% completion or less of the period of attendance. The amount of the refund is determined by deducting the registration fee from the total tuition charge, then dividing the remainder by the number of hours in the period of attendance to calculate the hourly charge. The refund is the amount in excess of what the student owes for total hours of instruction completed, including the non-refundable registration fee.

A student should send either through certified postal mail, hand deliver, or fax a written notice of cancellation or withdrawal addressed to the <u>School Registrar</u> at <u>California Trinity School of Business 2333 Beverly Blvd, Los Angeles, CA 90057</u>. The cancellation or withdrawal will take effect by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance.

In order to ensure that students are fully informed of their rights and procedures for recovering tuition refunds, each student is provided a copy of this Cancellation/Withdrawal Policy upon registration. In compliance with the applicable California Education Code (Section 94919), the School's cancellation/withdrawal and refund policy is also fully disclosed in the enrollment agreement.
