## Student's Right to Cancel

Students can do this in person, by phone, mail, hand delivery, or email. We do not have a format requirement for the verbal or written notice of cancellation but it must be expressed that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the enrollment agreement.

If any books and supplies were distributed to the student prior to cancellation, the student is responsible for the charges associated with those distributions. The student has the option to return any books and supplies, and receive full credit to their account, within 30 days following the date of cancellation.

NHI will refund 100% of any monies paid, less any charges for books and supplies retained by the student within 45 days of cancellation.

If the student has received federal financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from student financial aid program funds.

## Student's Right to Cancel

A student has the right to cancel his or her agreement for a course of instruction, without any penalty or obligation if notice of cancellation is made through attendance of the first class session or seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Cancellation may occur for the following reasons:
