following provisions. The student must fill out the <b>Change of Status Form</b> to cancel or change this Financial
Agreement and deliver it to the college either in person or by certified mail prior to the appropriate deadlines.
Refund or credit of all charges and fees, except application fee and registration fee, will apply upon full
withdrawal and notification prior to the first day of class. In addition, the student may drop a class after the first
session and receive a pro-rated refund or credit to their account for the unused portion of the tuition, all fees will
be applicable. The student may NOT drop a class after the second session. A student may withdraw completely
from EPIC Bible College and Graduate School after instruction has begun through the end of the fourth week of
class (60%) and receive a pro-rated refund or credit to their account of the unused portion of tuition, all fees will
be applicable. For example, if the student is enrolled in only one 4-unit course and completes 16 hours of the 40-
hour/4-unit course and paid \$996.00 tuition, then withdraws at the end of the fourth week, \$332.00 will be
refunded or credited to the student's account. In order to receive a refund a student must provide written

Sacramento, CA 95841. Pro-ration will be based on the date that EPIC receives the written request or the date on
the certified mail. Refunds shall be paid upon written request within 30 days of cancellation. Any balance still

including fees and books.
