3. A student will be determined to be withdrawn from the institution if the student misses over (7) consecutive instructional days and all of the days are unexcused.

For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employment in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

SEVEN-DAY CANCELLATION: An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within seven (7) business days, excluding weekends and holidays, of executing the enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all monies paid, excluding the \$150 non-refundable online registration fee. The notice of cancellation shall be in writing and submitted directly to [California Electrology Academy](#).

OTHER CANCELLATIONS: An application requesting cancellation more than seven (7) days after executing the enrollment agreement and making an initial payment, but prior to beginning the online theoretical portion is entitled to a refund of all monies paid, less a maximum tuition fee of 15% of the stated cost of the course.

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE

1. A student choosing to withdraw from the school after the commencement of classes is to provide a written notice to the Director of the school, [Johanne Fortier Gonella](#). The notice must include the expected last date of attendance and be signed and dated by the student.
2. If special circumstances arise, a student may request, in writing, a leave of absence, which should include the date the student anticipates the leave beginning and ending. The withdrawal date will be the date the student is scheduled to return to from the leave of absence but fails to do so.
3. A student will be determined to be withdrawn from the institution if the student misses over (7) consecutive instructional days and all of the days are unexcused.
4. All refunds will be submitted within 45 days of the determination of the withdrawal date.

REFUND POLICY: After the cancellation period (seven days), the institution provides a pro rata refund of **ALL** funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 75 percent or less of the period of attendance. Once more than 75 percent of the enrollment period in the entire course has incurred (**including absences**), there will be no refund to the student.

The online registration fee of **\$150.00 is a non-refundable item**. Equipment, books, supplies, tools, uniforms, kits and any other items **issued and received by the student** are not returnable or refundable. **Once received** by the student it will belong to the student and will represent a liability to the student.

If you cancel the agreement, the school will refund any money that you paid, less any deduction for registration fee and equipment received. If you withdraw from school after the cancellation period, the refund policy described above will apply. If the amount that you have paid is more than the amount that you owe for the time you attended, then a refund will be made within 45 days of the official withdrawal. See Refunds section below. If the amount that you owe is more than the amount that you have already paid, then you will have to arrange to pay it. Official withdrawal date is on the student's notification or school's determination.
