CANCELLATION OF ENROLLMENT & STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The Colburn Conservatory of Music is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) and observes NASM policies regarding the commitment to enroll. The State of California confers additional rights in allowing a student to cancel enrollment in and withdraw from the Colburn Conservatory of Music and obtain a refund of charges as below:

- Withdrawal before the start of the semester or within the first two weeks of classes: complete refund of comprehensive fee and parking amounts paid to date.
- Withdrawal beginning in week three through week eight of classes: prorated refund of comprehensive fee and parking amounts paid to date, calculated on a 15-week semester.
- Withdrawal beginning in week nine of the semester: no refund of comprehensive or parking fees.

If you have received any equipment (including musical instruments), you must return it within 30 days of the date you signed your notice of withdrawal.
