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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Other miscellaneous charges that the student may have incurred at the institution (EG: extra kit materials, books, products, unreturned Institution property, etc.) will be calculated separately at the time of withdrawal. All fees are identified in the catalog and in the enrollment agreement.

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
