#### **Definitions**

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

  incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or
  do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an
  accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.

#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Students will be permitted to withdraw from their enrollment in the California University of Science and Medicine (CUSM) School of Medicine (SOM) MD program, without any penalty or obligation, during the first seven (7) days of the first semester. In this case, the late payment fee will also be waived/refunded. After this initial seven (7) days, tuition refunds may be applicable based on the Tuition Refund Policy in the CUSM Catalog.

To withdraw from the CUSM MD program, the student will be required to mail or deliver a signed and dated copy of a notice of their intent to withdraw to:

Upon withdrawal, any payments made and/or any negotiable instruments signed by students shall be returned within 45 days following the receipt of the notice to withdraw from the program.

Students who withdraw and may have received any equipment, will be required to return the equipment within 30 days of the date they signed the notice of withdrawal. Failure to return the equipment within this 30-day period, will serve as permission for CUSM to withhold from any refunded amount an amount equal to the cost of the equipment. The total amount charged for each item of equipment shall not exceed the equipment's replacement value including the University's overhead.
