# STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL & REFUND POLICY

In the event a student elects to withdraw from attendance, that student will have rights to a full refund if cancellation is initiated formally as follows:

To cancel the course and be eligible for a refund, a student must submit in writing their notice to cancel through attendance of the first class session, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later. If the cancellation is mailed in rather than hand-delivered, the letter must be submitted to 3355 Myrtle Ave Ste 200, North Highlands, CA, 95660, and the postmark must be prior to the first day of class, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Should a student withdrawal from the course and be eligible for a refund, the refund will be paid to the student, department, or agency that paid the course fees. In the event that a student withdrawal prior to the completion of 60 percent of the course, refunds will be dispersed on a pro rata basis. Should a student withdrawal after 60 percent completion, no refunds will be dispersed.

If any portion of your tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan, then the refund will be sent to the lender or to the agency that guaranteed the loan, if any. Any remaining amount of refund will first be used to repay any student financial aid programs from which you received benefits, in proportion to the amount of the benefits received. Any remaining amount will be paid to you. If there is a balance due, you will be responsible to pay that amount.

If the student obtained a loan to pay for an educational program, the student has the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund.
