Prerequisites

The following trainings have prerequisites. Applicants must provide proof of achieving prerequisites.

- Holistic Health Practitioner (NeuroPhysical Reprogramming): Applicants must have certification in a health related field; as a health professional with a degree and 3 years work experience.
- Naturopathic Practitioner: Applicants must have certification in a health related field.
- Advanced Holistic Health Practitioner: Holistic Health Practitioner Training.
- **Homeopathic Endocrinology:** To pre-qualify for this training you must be a state or nationally certified or licensed health professional.
- Biological Dental Consultant: Applicants must be a health provider or a licensed Dental Professional.
- NeuroEndocrine Regulation & Anti-Aging Certification Seminar: Applicant must have completed the prerequisite training; work as a health provider or a licensed health professional.

Profession

VISA and English Language Requirement

Global students are welcome to enroll provided they have completed English instruction with proficiency document submitted with their application according to the United States Foreign Service Language Rating System. English language proficiency is required of all students. If students are not proficient in English, The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), will be accepted. No instruction will occur in a language other than English. We do not provide VISA services and only offer trainings in English language.

Graduation

Graduation from this training does not include the right to diagnose or treat any condition.

Graduation will take place at the end of a course where each student that has satisfied the requirements and received a passing grade of 70% will be presented with a Diploma/Certificate of Completion. Students will receive a pass or fail grade.

Attendance, Drop-Out and Leave of Absence Policies

Attendance is mandatory in residential class in order to graduate. If the student is absent for part of a session, they will be given an incomplete and will be able to take the class again when it is offered or purchase the audio of the missed class and take the test for that class. Then they may go on to the next class, in sequence.

Online distance education attendance.

Student attendance in online courses is defined as active participation in the course as described in the individual course syllabus. Online courses will, at a minimum, have weekly mechanisms for student participation no more frequently than daily, which can be documented by any or all of the following methods:

- · Completion of module tests or quizzes
- · Submission/completion of assignments
- · Communication with the instructor
- Or other course participation

Students are required to log in to each online course by the second day during the week in which the course officially begins, or the day enrolled during late registration to complete the initial introductory postings required in the course. As a component of attendance student email, course announcements and discussion forums should be checked frequently (daily is recommended). The student is solely responsible for checking updates related to the course. Note: nonattendance may affect financial aid. If a student fails to meet the attendance requirements, he or she may be recommended for withdrawal from the course. In the case of an anticipated absence, such as military deployment, the student should contact the instructor in advance,

in writing, and make arrangements to complete the required assignments. In case of an emergency (illness/accident or death in family), a student should contact the instructor, in writing, as soon as possible providing documentation supporting the need for any late submission of a graded event.

Progress and Performance Policy

Written exams after each module will assess student progress. If a student fails a class, they must take the class over.

Grading Policy

Student's performance will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Proficiency in the procedures and exercises.
- The student's confidence in his or her ability to follow procedures or exercises.
- Student's ability to achieve reproducible results in testing methods.
- · The demonstrated ability to accurately assess any client.
- Student will receive a pass/fail grade. A passing grade is 70%.

Readmission

Students who have not turned in homework assignments to the college for more than one year must apply for readmission by sending in another registration fee and may be required to submit a new application with supporting documentation. Applicants must meet the admission requirements in effect at the time of readmission, follow the new curriculum, and pay the tuition according to the most current standards. Students seeking readmission should write a letter for readmission.

Equipment

If equipment is necessary for a training it is specified under Tuition in this catalog. A computer and printer is necessary for all online trainings.

Student Services

Housing, transportation, books, necessary supplies, materials, shop fees, or other fees the student will incur upon enrollment are not included in the cost of training unless specifically specified in this catalog.

Student counseling is offered at no charge related to their performance, their future and classwork.

Academic programs and services at the California College of Natural Medicine are available to all students without regard to age, race, religion, color, national origin, sex or disability. Any item in this catalog is subject to modification at any time by proper administrative procedure.

Library, Textbooks and Reading List

Since our trainings are online, we do not offer a traditional Library at our offices. Instead there is a reading list above the course description of each training on the institutions website at www.cconm.com. The reading list is available to any potential student so they are aware of the educational materials needed before enrollment. The books on the reading list serves as a custom library for each training, There are also links, as part of a training to online education and research material providing the most updated research on the topic of their training available globally.

Transportation, Room & Board

Room and Board is not included. We do not offer dormitory facilities and are not responsible for securing your housing, **however**, we will recommend housing reasonably near our facilities. Housing in the area ranges from \$80.00 to \$180.00 per night. You are responsible for calling for pricing and availability and securing your room and board.

FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

Classes are held both Online and Residential, depending on the training. Residential classes will be held at the approved location; 143 Figueroa, #17, Ventura, CA, capacity of room is 10 students and the classroom size (20' x 16'). The institution bears no responsibility to find or provide student housing. We can offer the student direction to locate appropriate housing in or near the training location, which can range from \$85.00 to \$220.00. The California College of Natural Medicine provides residential instruction for its programs with updated equipment such as massage tables for testing new modalities (when applicable), product samples (when applicable), notepads, pens, and instruction manuals.

Distance education shall be completed in a comfortable learning environment provided by the student. A functional computer with Internet access is required to complete each program that is studied as "Distance Education".

Payment Schedule

Students are required to pay for the full program at the time of registration, unless financing has been arranged.

Registration Fees

Registration fees are charged for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a student file. Registration fees must accompany the Application for Admissions. Applications received without the required fee will not be processed. A separate registration fee is required for each program. Registration Fees are Non-Refundable. Students who have completed one program and are applying to an additional program will be charged an additional registration fee.

Late Registration Fee

A late application of \$50 applies when student's application materials including official transcripts are not received 30 days before residential classes start. The California College of Natural Medicine reserves the right to make any changes in tuition, refund policies, fees, and expenses without notice, within statutory guidelines.

Financial Aid

Financial aid may be arranged for trainings according to credit history. Our policy is that all tuition be paid in full either before graduation or during the completion of the final module. Therefore, if the training is 24 months, CCNM will require 24 monthly payments, which include 9% interest on unpaid balance. Tuition payment shall be paid in full by the last month of training. We also accept Master Card and Visa payments, unless you choose a finance program.

CCNM does not participate in federal and state financial aid programs. However, if the student receives federal student financial aid fund, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal financial aid funds.

CCNM has never filed for or operated in bankruptcy. CCNM does not have a pending petition in bankruptcy and is not operating as a debtor in possession, nor has the institution filed a petition within the preceding five years, nor has the institution had a petition in bankruptcy filed against it within the preceding five years that resulted in reorganization under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code (11 U.S.C. Sec. 1101 et seq.).

Loans

You are responsible for all tuition. If the student has received a student loan, you are responsible for repaying the loan amount plus any interest, le s the amount of any refund.

Employer Assistance with Tuition

Many employers underwrite programs to assist employees with their education expenses. CCNM encourages students to seek educational assistance from their employer. The College will gladly prepare any reports or other information necessary to meet the requirements of such programs.

Scholarships

NO scholarships funds are available.

Withdrawal, Cancellation and Refunds

Distance Education Program

After enrollment, the student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid *before the first class session and materials are received*. All requests for cancellations must be submitted in writing to the Chief Academic Officer, Theresa Dale at CCNM's mailing address.

Refund After Cancellation Period

If a student withdraws from a course after the cancellation period, the student is entitled to only a partial refund. The refund policy is pro rated to the 60 percent point of the course. The formula is as follows:

Total Amount Actually Paid for Lessons taken minus the Registration Fee of \$250.00 = Adjusted Amount (Includes all fees and instruction, but no equipment)

Adjusted Amount X Lessons not received but for which the student has paid = Final Refund Amount. All refunds will be paid within 45 days of cancellation or withdrawal.

Cancellation Refund Example

A student enrolls in the Naturopathic Practitioner Program and pays total tuition including a \$250.00 registration fee. The student cancels on the first day of class. The student's refund would be total tuition minus the \$250.00 registration fee. The \$250.00 registration fee is non-refundable.

Withdrawal Refund Example:

A student enrolls in any program and pays the full tuition, including a \$250.00 non refundable registration fee.. The student withdraws after completing 75 percent of the course. The student would not receive a refund because he or she has completed over 60 percent of the program. On the other hand, if the student has paid total tuition (including the \$250.00 registration fee) completes 50% of the training and wants to withdraw from the training – they would receive a refund for the lessons that they did not take or receive a password for. All cancellations and requests for refunds must be submitted to the school office in writing.

If there is partial tuition payment, the student will only be able to access the online classes that they have paid for. When full payment for tuition is received, ALL classes will be available to the student. Approximately ten days will elapse between the institution's receipt of student lessons, projects, or dissertations and the institution's mailing of its response or evaluation.

Withdrawals and Refunds

Classroom Programs

A notice of cancellation shall be in writing, and a withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the *first class session*, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. The institution shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).

The institution shall issue a refund for unearned institutional charges if the student cancels an enrollment agreement or withdraws during a period of attendance. The refund policy for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance shall be a pro rated refund. The institution shall pay or credit refunds within 45 days of a student's cancellation or withdrawal.

Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent. Emailed cancellations are not accepted. If the institution sent the first lesson and materials before an effective cancellation notice was received, the institution shall make a refund within 45 days after the student's return of the materials.

Approximately ten days will elapse between the institution's receipt of student lessons, projects, or dissertations and the institution's mailing of its response or evaluation.

The institution shall transmit all of the lessons and other materials to the student if the student has fully paid for the educational program; and after the institution has received the first lesson test and required documents related to the class.

If an institution transmits the balance of the material as the student requests, the institution shall remain obligated to provide the other educational services it agreed to provide, such as responses to student inquiries, student and faculty interaction, and evaluation and comment on lessons submitted by the student, but shall not be obligated to pay any refund after all of the classes and material are transmitted by email. The enrollment agreement shall disclose the institution's and student's rights and duties under this section.

Refund After Cancellation Period: If a student withdraws from a course after the cancellation period, the student is entitled to only a partial refund. The refund policy is pro rated to the 60 percent point of the course. The formula is as follows:

Total Amount Actually Paid for Lessons taken minus the Registration Fee of \$250.00 = Adjusted Amount (Includes all fees and instruction, but no equipment)

Adjusted Amount X Lessons not received but for which the student has paid = Final Refund Amount.

All refunds will be paid within 45 days of cancellation or withdrawal.

Cancellation Refund Example:

Leave of Absence

These trainings are designed for self-study. Distance learning programs are arranged by estimated clock hours and expected months to complete course modules. Should a student request in writing a leave of absence; the institute will assess and grant the student's request within a reasonable timeframe. Should the student disregard communication from the institute post the allotted leave of absence time, a grade of incom-plete will be issued to the student's records.

Attendance is mandatory in residential class in order to graduate. If the student is absent for part of a session, they will be given an incomplete and will be able to take the class again when it is offered.

Student Tuition Recovery Fund

The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tui-tion, and suffered an economic loss. Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is a California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition.

You are not eligible for protection from the STRF and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program."

It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss as a result of any of the following:

- 1. The institution, a location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.
- 2. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120 day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120 day period before the program was discontinued.
- 3. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.
- 4. The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.

- 5. The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law, or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution in excess of tuition and other costs.
- 6. You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.
- 7. You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.

To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF.

A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of noncollection may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4 year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law.

However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number."

Although the identical topics were used, the delivery was different. The patient said the topics aloud, instead of my saying them. The reason for this is that kinesiological testing which is a very small but important part of the NPR protocol has a very poor accuracy rate if the patient does not make the statements. If the doctor states it for the patient, the doctor is essentially testing themselves and not the patient.
