# STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student may cancel this agreement and receive a refund of all monies paid including the registration fee if canceled by the end of the third day following the signing of this agreement. A student who cancels this agreement after the third day of signing this agreement but prior to touring the campus will also receive a full refund of all monies paid. Students who cancel this agreement after the third day but within seven days of signing this agreement or by the first date of attendance or whichever day is later shall be entitled a full refund including tuition, lab fees, and materials less the registration fee. In addition, students may withdraw from a course or program after instruction has started and receive a pro-rated refund for the unused portion of the tuition, as well as other refundable charges, if the student has completed 60 percent or less of the course or program. In this case, the student's Last Day of Attendance (LDA) is the date from which the school will calculate the pro-rated refund. The student will be charged for all days up to, and including, the LDA. The LDA is defined as the last day that the student attends the course or program. If a student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund, and if the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. All refunds will be paid within 45days of the Date of Determination. MUD will also refund payments collected from a third party. # **Definitions**

- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

# STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student may cancel this agreement and receive a refund of all monies paid including the registration fee if canceled by the end of the third day following the signing of this agreement. A student who cancels this agreement after the third day of signing this agreement but prior to touring the campus will also receive a full refund of all monies paid. Students who cancel this agreement after the third day but within seven days of signing this agreement or by the first date of attendance or whichever day is later shall be entitled a full refund including tuition, lab fees, and materials less the registration fee. In addition, students may withdraw from a course or program after instruction has started and receive a pro-rated refund for the unused portion of the tuition, as well as other refundable charges, if the student has completed 60 percent or less of the course or program. In this case, the student's Last Day of Attendance (LDA) is the date from which the school will calculate the pro-rated refund. The student will be charged for all days up to, and including, the LDA. The LDA is defined as the last day that the student attends the course or program. If a student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund, and if the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. All refunds will be paid within 45days of the Date of Determination. MUD will also refund payments collected from a third party. Should MUD cancel or discontinue a course or educational program, the school will issue an appropriate refund of all charges. All refunds will be paid within 45 days of the cancellation date.
