## STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

---

A student may cancel their enrollment agreement at any time without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last date of attendance. Cancellation will occur when the student provides written notice of cancellation or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, lack of attendance. A student subsequently requesting cancellation will be refunded all monies paid to the school minus the enrollment fee of \$100 (returning students), \$75 (new students), within 45 days after notice of cancellation is received.
