# **STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL. You have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and get a refund. The institution, for all students, without penalty or obligation, shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), <u>if the notice of cancellation is made prior to or on the first day of instruction or the seventh day after enrollment whichever is later.</u> Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the address of the Institution shown on the top of this Agreement. You can do this by mail, hand delivery, or email. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid.

The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by this Agreement.

**REFUND INFORMATION.** You may withdraw from the program through 60% of your period of financial obligation and receive a prorated refund for the unused portion of the tuition.
