(CANCELLATION, TERMINATION, and REFUND POLICIES): The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges minus the \$250 registration fee, paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. (On or before _____) After the first day, refunds are pro-rata the registration fee for up to 60% of the education hours received beyond which there is no refund on the unused portion of tuition. Cancellation of enrolment must be made either in person (delivered to office staff in writing) or by certified mail. The student must receive written confirmation if notice is hand delivered. Cancellations cannot be made retroactive to a date prior to delivery of notice in writing. Attendance time is the time between the scheduled starting date of the first class and the date on which the student formally cancels his/her enrollment in writing whether or not the student attends class. Cancellation cannot be made by telephone. A refund will be made of the unused portion of tuition within 30 days following the student's formal withdrawal date. The Institute reserves the right to have any student terminate his/her enrollment if, in the sole discretion of the Director, continued enrollment would not be in the best interest of the Institute or the student. Such a right of termination shall be exercised in writing by the Institute and either delivered personally to the student or mailed to his/her local address set forth above. If you obtained a loan to pay for an educational program, you will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund, and if you have received federal student financial aid funds, you are entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
