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This program is new. DEFINITIONS

- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You are entitled to a full refund of any monies paid to the California Phlebotomy if your cancellation request is received at least 1 full business day before the first class of the session for which you have enrolled. Any cancellation request received on, or after, the first day of class will be subject to the refund amounts listed in the table below.

After the commencement of class if the student quits attending OR requests to withdraw, we will refund based on the following attendance schedule. Once a student has attended 70% or more of the classes offered during the session they signed up for, NO REFUNDS will be given pursuant to CEC 94920.

- Attended 1 Saturday Class or 1 &/or 2 Morning or Evening Classes = 75% full tuition (Minus registration fee)
- Attended 2 Saturday Classes or 3 &/or 4 Morning or Evening Classes = 50% full tuition (Minus registration fee)
- Attended 3 Saturday Classes or 4, 5 &/or 6 Morning or Evening Classes = 25% full tuition (Minus registration fee)
- Attended 4 or 5 Saturday Classes or 7+ Morning or Evening Classes = NO REFUND
