Days in Agreement: 365

Withdrew: April 1, 2022

Days Enrolled: 151

% Year Enrolled: $151 \text{ days} \div 365 \text{ days} = 41.37\%$

Tuition owed: $\$8,400 \times 41.37\% = \$3,475.07$

If student had paid for six months when they withdrew (6×700) = \$4,200

Then the student would have a refund of \$4,200 (what they paid) - \$3,475.07 (pro rata portion for the number of days in the year they were enrolled) = \$724.93

Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

CANCELLATION POLICY: You have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund for tuition paid for any days in which you are not enrolled. [Except if you withdraw or cancel within the first month, you will receive a complete refund of all tuition, except for the \$250 enrollment fee.]

DISTANCE EDUCATION CANCELLATION POLICY: The student shall have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund, including the \$50 application fee and the \$200 enrollment fee, within 7 days of the beginning of the agreement or before the first lesson and materials are received, or the first meeting with a faculty member, whichever is later. Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent. The institution shall make the refund pursuant to section 71750 of the California Code of Regulations. If the institution sent the first lesson and materials before an effective cancellation notice was received, the institution shall make a refund within 45 days after the student's return of the materials.

- An institution offering a distance educational program where the instruction is not offered in real time shall transmit the first lesson and any materials to any student within seven days after the institution accepts the student for admission.
- An institution shall transmit all lessons and materials to the student if the student has fully paid for the educational program and, after having received the first lesson and initial materials, requests in writing that all of the material be sent. If an institution transmits the balance of the material as the student requests, the institution shall remain obligated to provide the other educational services it agreed to provide, such as responses to student inquiries, student and faculty interaction and comment on lessons submitted by the student, but shall not be obligated to pay any refund after all of the lessons and materials are transmitted.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL: The student has a right to cancel and obtain a full refund of all monies paid, including the \$50 application fee and the \$200 enrollment fee, through attendance at the first meeting with a WISR faculty person, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. Such cancellation may be in writing to the President at WISR, 2930 Shattuck Avenue, Suite 300, Berkeley, CA 94705. A Full Refund, including the \$50 application fee and the \$200 enrollment fee, may be obtained by withdrawing within 7 days of the beginning of an



enrollment agreement, or at the student's first instructional session, whichever is later. If a student withdraws after instruction begins and after the seventh day, but before the end of the first month of enrollment or re-enrollment (that is, after the cancellation period described above), they will be refunded all except the \$250 enrollment fee.

Notice of cancellation of an Enrollment Agreement may be in writing to WISR's President, and a withdrawal may also be effectuated by the student's oral notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance.

PROCESSES FOR WITHDRAWING: A withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. The student will receive a pro-rata refund of any tuition already paid toward days in which he or she will not be enrolled.

REFUND INFORMATION: If a student withdraws after instruction begins, but before the end of the first month of enrollment or re-enrollment (that is, after the cancellation period described above), they are entitled to a full refund of all charges, less \$250. If the student withdraws at the end of the first month or later, they will be refunded tuition on a pro rata per day basis, less the \$250 enrollment fee.

That is, in no case will the student be responsible to pay tuition for days for which they have contracted in the Enrollment Agreement, when they have chosen to withdraw before the end of that period. WISR will also refund money collected for a student's tuition from a third party on the student's behalf. Refunds will be paid within 30 days of cancellation or withdrawal. A student who withdraws and wishes to later re-enroll is subject to the policies on Leaves of Absence. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

SAMPLE REFUND CALCULATION:

Student Enrollment Agreement began November 1, 2021 (and through October 31, 2022)

Days in Agreement: 365

Withdrew: April 1, 2022

Days Enrolled: 151

% Year Enrolled: 151 days divided by 365 days = 41.37%

Tuition owed: \$8,400 x 41.37% = \$3,475.07

If student had paid for six months when they withdrew (6 x 700) = \$4,200

Then the student would have a refund of \$4,200 (what they paid) - \$3,475.07 (pro rata portion for the number of days in the year they were enrolled) = \$724.93
