STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

- 1. A student has the right to stop school at any time; and has the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled day in the current payment period in the course through the last day of attendance. Refunds will be dispersed within 45 days following written notification of withdrawal and application for refund. If a student has attended 60% or less of a program (In-class/Didactic) then their refund will be prorated by the percentage attended. If a student has attended more than 60% of a program (In-class/Didactic) then the student is not eligible for a refund. If eligible for a refund, refundable portion does not include \$250.00 registration fee, application fee, uniform, and any equipment. STUDENTS MUST CANCEL IN WRITING. You do not have the right to cancel by telephoning the school or by not coming to class.
- 2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: 1175 Shaw, Suite 103. Clovis, CA 93612. This must be done by hand delivery. The written notice of cancellation needs to be on a Notice of Cancellation Form, available upon request.
- 3. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
- 4. Student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.
- 5. If you have completed the program with a grade of 80% or higher but are unable to complete the externship, you may apply in writing, to receive a refund in the amount of \$250 and a certificate of completion for the classroom portion of the course. Students are not eligible to request a refund for not completing their externship if they were, for any reason, terminated from their assigned site.
