WITHDRAWAL POLICY

REFUND POLICY

In addition, the student may withdraw from a course after instruction has started and receive a pro-rata refund for the unused portion of the tuition, if you have completed 60% or less of the instruction.

Student will be charged \$25 dollars late fee each time they delayed tuition payment for up to 3 days and there on, \$25 dollars fee for every day will be charged up to 8 days. After 10 days school has the right to drop student for non-payment and students is still responsible for paying full tuition. If the student was referred by another



agency and in the event agency failed to provide full tuition then student, parent/legal guardian/spouse, or responsible party is responsible for paying full tuition to the institution.
