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Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Should the student be terminated or cancel for any reason, all refunds will be made per the following refund policy and schedule:

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL – WITHIN THE CANCELLATION PERIOD

1. You have the right to cancel the Enrollment Agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. Cancellation will occur when student gives **written notice of cancellation at the address** shown on the front page of the Enrollment Agreement. A signed and dated notice of cancellation may be given by mail, hand delivery or telegram. The notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail, properly addressed with postage prepaid. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and however expressed, is effective if it states that a student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement. Students who cancel their Enrollment Agreement will receive a refund of all amount paid **within 45 days of cancellation.**
2. If a student obtains equipment specified on the Enrollment Agreement as a separate charge and returns it in good condition – allowing for reasonable wear and tear – within 30 days following the date of student cancellation, the school will refund the equipment cost paid by the student. If the student fails to return the equipment within the 30-day period, the school may retain the equipment cost paid by the student. The school will refund the portion of the proceeds exceeding the documented cost of the equipment within 30 days following the equipment return period. The student may retain the equipment without further financial obligation to the school.
3. If the student has received federal student aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL – AFTER THE CANCELLATION PERIOD

1. After the end of the cancellation period or after the seventh day following the first scheduled class session, students have the right to withdraw from the Institution at any time. You have the right to receive a **pro rata refund** if you have completed **60% or less** of the scheduled days (or hours) in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. Refunds are based on the portion of the program not completed, less the non-refundable registration fee of \$100. Students who withdraw after the cancellation period will receive a refund **within 45 days of withdrawal.**
2. Uniforms, patches, books, medical equipment, and ID will be **charged in full.**
