- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

IN-PERSON AT THE INSTITUTE

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO WITHDRAW

If tuition and fees are collected in advance of the start date of a program and the institution cancels the class, the institution refunds 100% of the tuition and fees collected. If tuition and fees are collected in advance of the start date of classes and the student does not begin classes or withdraws on the first day of classes, the institution retains no more than \$100 of the tuition and fees.

The student has the right to withdraw from the program of instruction and to obtain a refund, in accordance with the procedures set forth below. A student is deemed to have withdrawn from a course when: (1) The student notifies the institution of his/her withdrawal or the date of withdrawal, whichever is later; (2) The institution terminates the student's enrollment; or (3) The student fails to attend class for a three-week period.

STUDENT/BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Students who have not visited the school facility prior to enrollment have the opportunity to withdraw without penalty within three days following either attendance at a regularly-scheduled orientation or following a tour of the facilities and inspection of the equipment.

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund, without any penalty or obligation, until the first class day or seventh business day following the date (1) of the first class attended; (2) upon which the student received a copy of the Notice of Cancellation; or (3) upon which the student received a copy of the enrollment agreement and the school catalog with any addenda, whichever is later. The institution is obligated to make the refund to the student within 45 days after the institution receives the student's written notice of cancellation. However, if the institution gave the student any equipment and the student fails to return the equipment within 30 days following the date of the notice of cancellation, the institution may deduct the documented cost to the institution of the equipment from the refund; the remaining amount of the refund will be reimbursed to the student within 45 days after the period within which the student is required to return the equipment. The student may retain the equipment without further obligation to pay.

The student must provide the institution with written notification expressing his/her desire not to be bound by the enrollment agreement or submit the signed Notice of Cancellation form to David Gibson, Director at 110 Caledonia St. Ste A. Sausalito, CA 94965 to be eligible for the refund.

ONLINE – DISTANCE LEARNING

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO WITHDRAW

The student has the right to withdraw from the program of instruction and to obtain a refund, in accordance with the procedures set forth below. A student is deemed to have withdrawn from a course when: (1) The student notifies the institution of his/her withdrawal or the date of withdrawal, whichever is later; (2) The institution terminates the student's enrollment.

REFUND POLICY
