## Definitions

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## **Students Right To Cancel - BPPE REGULATIONS**

Ed Code §94911(e)(1)(2)(3) BPPE CEC §94909(a)(8)(B)

The student has the right to cancel and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. You have the right to cancel for a course of instruction including any equipment such as books, materials and supplies or any other goods related to the instruction offered in this agreement, if notice of cancellation is made prior to or on the first day of instruction.

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

Cancellation shall occur when you have given notice of cancellation to the Admissions Department at Summit College. The notice of cancellation may be verbal, sent by mail/or email to the appropriate address listed below directed to the attention of Admissions Department. The notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by this agreement.

Summit shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

If the student cancels their enrollment agreement, Summit will not charge institutional charges; however, the College will retain the non-refundable application fee and may charge for used books and equipment not returned within the cancellation period.
