STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The Student has the right to cancel this enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance on the first day of class, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later. The amount of the refund is determined by deducting the registration fee from the total tuition charged, then dividing the remainder by the number of hours in the course to calculate the hourly charge. The refund is the amount in excess of what the student owes for total hours of instruction completed, excluding the non-refundable \$250 Registration Fee and STRF fee.
