IN-PERSON AT THE INSTITUTE

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO WITHDRAW

The Institute shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

The student has the right to withdraw from the program of instruction and to obtain a refund, in accordance with the procedures set forth below. A student is deemed to have withdrawn from a course when: (1) The student notifies the institution of his/her withdrawal or the date of withdrawal, whichever is later; (2) The institution terminates the student's enrollment; or (3) The student fails to attend class for a three-week period.

STUDENT/BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Students who have not visited the school facility prior to enrollment have the opportunity to withdraw without penalty within three days following either attendance at a regularly-scheduled orientation or following a tour of the facilities and inspection of the equipment.

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. The institution is obligated to make the refund to the student within 45 days after the institution receives the student's written notice of cancellation.

The student must provide the institution with written notification expressing his/her desire not to be bound by the enrollment agreement or submit the signed Notice of Cancellation form to David Gibson, Director at 110 Caledonia St. Ste A. Sausalito, CA 94965 to be eligible for the refund.

ONLINE – DISTANCE LEARNING

Globe Institute will transmit the first lesson and any materials to any student within seven days after the institution accepts the student for admission. The student shall have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund **before the first lesson and materials are received**. Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent. The institution shall make the

refund pursuant to section 71750 of the Regulations. If the institution sent the first lesson and materials before an effective cancellation notice was received, the institution shall make a refund within 45 days after the student's return of the materials.

(1) An institution shall transmit all lessons and materials to the student if the student has fully paid for the educational program and, after having received the first lesson and initial materials, requests in writing that all of the material be sent. (2) If an institution transmits the balance of the material as the student requests, the institution shall remain obligated to provide the other educational services it agreed to provide, but shall not be obligated to pay any refund after all of the lessons and material are transmitted.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO WITHDRAW

The Institute shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

REFUND POLICY

If Globe Institute transmits the balance of the material as the student requests, the institution shall remain obligated to provide the other educational services it agreed to provide, such as responses to student inquiries, student and faculty interaction, and evaluation and comment on lessons submitted by the student, but shall not be obligated to pay any refund after all of the lessons and material are transmitted. If the student is doing monthly payments (pay as you go) then drops the program then the student must still continue payments in full if materials have been received.

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a <u>full</u> refund minus the registration fee, without any penalty or obligation, **until the class materials are received.** The institution is obligated to make the refund to the student within 45 days after the institution receives the student's written notice of cancellation.

The student has a right to stop school after the cancellation period and receive a refund for the unused portion of the amount paid for the instruction less a registration fee not exceeding seventy-five dollars (\$75) if 60% or less of the course has been completed.
