After the 100% refund period described above, a student may withdraw from a course after instruction has started and receive a pro rata refund (less a non-refundable administrative processing fee of \$100.00) for the unused portion of the tuition and other refundable charges, if the student has completed 60% or less of the term's instruction.

The amount of the refund is calculated based on the student's withdrawal date. Transfer credits will be awarded with a deduction in overall tuition based on a per credit unit cost.
