Full Refund

Students, who cancel their enrollment before the Friday of the 2nd week of classes, are entitled to receive 100% of the amount paid for instructional charges (except the non-refundable fees, if applicable). If the scheduled classes are canceled by the university, students will receive a full refund.

Effective Dates for Refund

Refunds are computed on the date the *Notice of Cancellation/Withdrawal* is filed in the Registrar's Office. The weeks listed on the Refund Schedule below begin on the first day of the semester regardless of the day a student begins attending classes. No tuition refund is given after fourth week for full semester courses.

Effective Date of Cancellation or Withdrawal

All refunds due will be made within 30 calendar days from the effective date of cancellation or withdrawal.
